There have been lots of activities for the month of April:

The three day Kindergarten registration held at KCS screened twenty-three 5 year olds during the week of April 6th. The youngsters met with the team for about an hour each to partake in motor, language, and concept skill activities. Parents were given the opportunity to speak with the kindergarten staff. We expect additional students to register between now and the 2015- 2016 opening day.

Grade 2 and 3 had walking field trips to the Swift House in Kent; Grade 3 also went to the Institute for American Indian Studies in Washington, CT, as well as to Music Mountain in Falls Village.

Our Inventors Fair was held on April 9th. There were 29 students in grades 1-7 who participated. Inventions for those selected to go the state competition included *a multi nut cracker, toothbrush tidier, a light-up garbage can, and a backpack bug zapper*. Local artist Judi Barrett visited Grade 2 on April 10th. The KCS Library was transformed into Chewandswallow, the imaginary town in her world famous book, *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs*. During art class, students created giant 3-D food items that were hung from the ceiling to symbolize falling food. Second graders spent three weeks preparing for Judi's visit. They participated in literature circles, developed questions, wrote "food" poems, and completed many art projects. During her visit, Judi shared her childhood crafts, sketches/galleys, answered the students' questions and read several of her published books. The morning ended with a picnic lunch of pizza, chocolate chip cookies, and chocolate covered strawberries.

After School French classes began after our April vacation for grades 1 and 2. Valerie Vega does a fantastic job with the youngsters and the students really enjoy their classes and learning French phrases. The classes run for 6 weeks.
